Growth Mindset Makers

Have you heard? Mindset is the word! Over the past year, our staff has committed to learning about the power of developing a growth mindset on overall achievement and personal growth. Having a growth mindset means believing your talents and abilities can be developed through effort, a positive attitude, and perseverance. Think back on Aesop's *The Tortoise and the Hare*; many people will recount that the moral of the story was "slow and steady wins the race." Likewise, the fable also warns us not to rest on our natural talents because others may pass us by. When we think about education, we want our students to realize that learning is a process. When something is a challenge, it isn't that they CAN'T do it; they just can't do it YET. We don't expect perfection, but we do expect perseverance.

As you speak with your children about their achievement in school, shift the focus away from 'right now grades' to discussions on how to continuously grow and improve, or 'not yet grades.' Many of our students are already engaging in conversations with their teachers about cultivating a growth mindset, and realizing that there is ALWAYS room for improvement, no matter the score. We don't want high achievers to settle for what is easy, nor do we want students who need more time or assistance to feel discouraged.

Try framing each day of the week with a different mindset discussion at home:

- **Motivating Monday** – What is something you are doing that is hard, and how can we work together to overcome it?
- **Terrific Tuesday** – What is something that is going really well? How did you get to that point?
- **Wise Wednesday** – Have your son/daughter teach you a skill that he/she is mastering.
- **Try-It Thursday** – What is something new you want to try, or something new you are learning about?
- **Family Friday** – Celebrate the successes and make new goals.

Above all else, remember to praise the process, not the person. Praise children's efforts just as much or even more than their talents.

Skyward Family Access

Family Access is a web based tool designed to enhance parent/guardian and school communication. Before you can use family access, you must have a user name and password for your new account. Please go to the web address below and print out a school family access form. Fill it in and return it to school, along with a copy of your ID. Once the form is processed, an email will be sent to you with your user name and password. Using one password, you can access records for all of your children, even if they are attending different schools within the district.

Attendance Tips

As a reminder...signing out your children early will be reflected in their attendance. In elementary, it is marked as a tardy. In middle school, all classes missed are marked as absences. Please keep this mind when making appointments for your children.

Clinic News

Students who become ill or need first aid will be sent to the clinic. Written parental consent, authorized by a physician, must be provided if you wish the clinic to dispense medication. You will be notified with a phone call if your child is sent to the clinic and the situation requires your immediate attention. **ALL** medications are to be kept in the health clinic. This includes prescription and non-prescription medications. No medication, prescription or nonprescription (i.e. Tylenol, aspirin, or cough drops) can be given at school without a written Physician Authorization For Medication form (PA Form) filled out completely and correctly by the physician and signed by the physician. Medication should be brought to school by the parent and **MUST** be in the original container as dispensed by the pharmacist and labeled to match the physician's orders. **Students are not allowed to have any medication in their possession.** It is the student's responsibility to come to the clinic to take the medication and to remember to take the medication home. The clinic employee is not responsible for reminding students to take medication. If a student has a fever, the parent will be called to take the student home per the SLPS Clinic Policy. Students may return to school when fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications (Tylenol, Motrin, etc.).

Registration for the **2017-2018** school year is open from September 1, 2016- February 1, 2017. FAU will begin selecting students in March.
