

FAST Progress Monitoring Scores for Grade 3-8 Students

Student results for the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) Progress Monitoring (PM) tests are available for Grades 3-8. Parents can access their student's FAST results through Skyward Family Access. Parents can view and print scale scores, achievement levels, and a bar graph indicating where the scale score falls within the achievement level bands. A flier with instructions to locate FAST results for grade 3-8 students was sent home.



Star Progress Monitoring Score Reports for K-2 Students

Parents can locate scores for their child's performance on the Star Early Literacy, Literacy, and Math progress monitoring tests on Skyward. The "Portfolio" tab opens to an "Attachment" tab (reports cards are also posted here) where student scores and an Individual Score Report can be found. Both PM1 and PM2 scores can be located here.
